Quiz: Expressing Regret & Hypothetical Situations

Write **one sentence** for each prompt below using the correct structure. Each section includes two cases. Use your own experience or imagination.

◆ Part 1: Regret – should have + past participle

(Write something you regret not doing.)

- ☞ You didn't study for an important exam.

- ☞ You didn't say goodbye to a friend who moved away.

◆ Part 2: Regret – shouldn't have + past participle

(Write something you regret doing.)

- ☞ You spent all your money on something you didn't need.

- ☞ You said something hurtful during an argument.

◆ Part 3: Hypothetical – If + past perfect, would have + past participle

(Describe probable outcomes of imaginary past situations.)

- ☞ You didn't take a great opportunity to travel.

◆ **Part 4: Hypothetical – If + past perfect, wouldn't have + past participle**

(Describe how something bad could have been avoided.)

◆ **Part 5: Possibility – If + past perfect, could have + past participle**

(Describe a missed opportunity.)

- You missed your friend's birthday party.

- You didn't join a school club or team.

◆ **Part 6: Possibility – If + past perfect, couldn't have + past participle**

(Describe something that would have been impossible.)

- You were helped by a teacher during a difficult time.

- You received help from a friend when you were moving.
