ARE YOU A FAN?

- A** Fans are people with a special interest in something, like music, sports or books. Some people are fans of popular celebrities, like actors and singers. Are you a fan of any celebrities?
- B** The members of a fan club are interested in the same thing. Some fan clubs are small and some are very big. There are about 250 million fans in the Real Madrid fan club. What about you? Are you in any fan clubs?
- C** Fan sites are websites for fans, with information, photos, videos, blogs and more. There are also fan groups on social media. Ariana Grande has millions of followers. Is your favourite celebrity online?
- D** Some groups of fans have got unusual names. For example, Katy Perry fans are called 'KatyCats' and Drake fans are called 'Team Drizzy'. What about your favourite singers? Are they famous? Are there special names for their fans?

Dylan says: I'm a big fan of Dua Lipa. She's great!
