Mia also asked if the film would win any awards. Alex replied that he hoped so because the crew had put their heart into it. Finally, he told young filmmakers to **"keep learning, keep creating, and never give up."**

Grammar Point – Reported Speech + Reporting Verbs

1. What is Reported Speech?

It's how we tell someone what another person said, **without** using their exact words.

Example:

- Direct: "I love movies."
 - Reported: She said (that) she loved movies.
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2. Tense Changes in Reported Speech:

Direct speech	Reported speech
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Present →	Past
Past →	Past Perfect
Will →	Would
Can →	Could
Must/Have to →	Had to

Also, pronouns and time expressions change:

- "today" → "that day"
 - "tomorrow" → "the next day"
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3. Common Reporting Verbs & Meanings:

Verb	Meaning / When to use	Example in Direct Speech	Example in Reported Speech
say	report words generally	"We are ready."	He said they were ready.
tell	used when the listener is mentioned	"I'll help you."	She told me she would help me.
explain	give details or reasons	"We filmed in three countries."	She explained they had filmed in three countries.

Verb	Meaning / When to use	Example in Direct Speech	Example in Reported Speech
admit	say something is true, often negative	"Some scenes were dangerous."	He admitted some scenes had been dangerous.
mention	say something in passing	"Safety is important."	He mentioned that safety was important.
add	give more information	"They worked very hard."	He added they had worked very hard.
reply	answer a question	"I hope so."	He replied that he hoped so.
advise	recommend an action	"Talk to the director."	He advised me to talk to the director.
ask	make a question	"Where do you live?"	He asked where I lived.

- "They worked very hard." → Alex **said** they had worked very hard.
- "Some scenes were dangerous." → He **admitted** some scenes had been dangerous.
- "Safety is our first priority." → He **mentioned** that safety was their first priority.
