The Amazing Koala

The koala is an iconic Australian animal. Often called the 'koala bear', it is not a bear but a marsupial, meaning that the young are carried in a pouch. They are well known for their large, round head, big furry ears, and large, black nose.

Koalas live in the eucalyptus forests of southeastern and eastern Australia. They have a very specialised diet, eating only the leaves of eucalyptus trees. An adult koala eats about one kilogram of leaves each night. This diet is toxic to most other animals, but koalas have a special digestive system that can break down the tough leaves. Because eucalyptus leaves provide very little energy, koalas spend most of their time sleeping – sometimes up to 20 hours a day!

A baby koala is called a 'joey'. When it is born, it is only about 2 centimetres long, blind, and has no fur. It crawls into its mother's pouch immediately after birth and stays there for about six months, drinking only milk. After leaving the pouch, the joey rides on its mother's back for another few months, learning how to find leaves to eat.

Unfortunately, koalas are facing several threats. Their habitat is disappearing due to deforestation for housing and agriculture. They are also at risk from bushfires and diseases. Conservation groups are working hard to protect these unique animals and their forest homes.


