Ferns in the Environment

The hardy fern has a root system that branches out and adds moisture to the soil, which helps prevent soil erosion and aids stabilisation. They are great indicators of soil, air and water quality. Their fronds are sensitive to pollutants. Studies have revealed that ferns help remove heavy metals from soil.

Nadia was able to feed one of the cubs under the expert guidance of the keeper. Nadia also learnt how to feed apple using a piece of string attached to a long bamboo pole. It was an unforgettable experience for young Nadia who was chosen by the Malaysian government to go on the trip.

The Pacific Northwest Tree Octopus is a fake animal created in 1998 by Lyle Zapato. Zapato's website says the tree octopus is real, and that it lives on both land and water. Zapato created this website about the fake tree octopus to show how important it is to think carefully about whether things on the Internet are true.

The original website that described the fake species is commonly used as an example in internet literacy classes to teach students to check more carefully if sources of information are reliable.

The text included other hoax species and organisations, mixed with links to pages about real species and organisations. Despite the falsehoods shown on the site, all 25 seventh-grade students involved in one well-publicised test believed the content. All but one of the 25 rated the site as 'very credible'.

An orangutan named Karen, the first in the world to have open-heart surgery in 1994, has made medical history again: She's among the first great apes to get a Covid-19 vaccine.

In February, Karen, three other orangutans, and five bonobos at the San Diego Zoo received two doses each of an experimental vaccine for animals developed by a veterinary pharmaceutical company, says Nadine Lamberski, chief conservation and wildlife health officer at the San Diego Zoo Wildlife Alliance.

In January, a troop of eight gorillas at the San Diego Zoo Safari Park became the first great apes in the world to test positive for the novel coronavirus. The silverback, 49-year-old Winston, fell ill with heart disease and pneumonia, but following experimental antibody treatment, he is recovering, as are the others.

Globally, infections have also been confirmed in tigers, lions, mink, snow leopards, cougars, a ferret, dogs and domestic cats, but the fact that great apes are susceptible to the virus has scientists especially concerned.

Diversity activities teach young children to respect and celebrate the differences in all people. Learning about different cultural aspects offers new experiences for children. When do children notice differences between people? At about two years of age, children begin to notice gender and racial differences. At 2½ or so, children learn gender labels (boy/girl) and the name of colours – which they begin to apply to skin colour. Around three years of age, children notice physical disabilities. At about four to five years, they start to display gender appropriate behaviour and become fearful of differences.

Stem cells have gained popularity not only among scientists, but also among the public in recent years. In Malaysia, there is also an increasing trend of stem cell clinics being set up by local and international companies. Stem cell therapies are capable of restoring organ functions via regeneration and functional repair of damaged tissues. The only approved stem cell therapies by the Ministry of Health (MOH) currently are the bone marrow and peripheral blood stem cell transplantation for the treatment of haematological disorders such as leukaemia and thalassaemia. The application of stem cells for other indications is still in the research stage.
