

PAST SIMPLE:

Present

He **plays** soccer every Monday.

She **doesn't write** songs.

Do they listen to Jack Sun?

Yes, they **do**. / No, they **don't**.

Past

He **played** soccer last Monday.

She **didn't write** a book last year.

Did they listen to Jack Sun last week?

Yes, they **did**. / No, they **didn't**.

Usamos el pasado simple para hablar de situaciones que sucedieron en el pasado y sabemos CUANDO sucedieron: I went to school **yesterday**. Yo fui a la escuela **ayer**. ¿Cuándo? Ayer.

Los verbos o acciones se dividen en 2: REGULARES e IRREGULARES:

- Cuando les tengo que agregar "**ED**" son **REGULARES**. Sin embargo, a veces sólo le debo agregar la "**D**" o si terminan en consonante + Y lo cambio a "**IED**".

"Last year, I travel**ed** to Bariloche." "My friend lik**ed** apples when he was a baby." "The baby cri**ed** last night."

- Otros verbos son **IRREGULARES**, porque su forma de escribir y de pronunciarlos es diferente y me los tengo que aprender: "**go**" se convierte: She **went** to the park.

"**have**" : They **had** a good teacher in primary school.

"**see**" : Samy **saw** a bird singing in the window.

Lo bueno es que, para armar oraciones NEGATIVAS, sólo tengo que poner el auxiliar **DIDN'T** delante de los verbos y los verbos quedan en estado "normal", es decir que no les agrego **ed, d, ied**, o **no los escribo diferente**. Vamos a mirar estos ejemplos que puse más arriba:

"She **went** to the park."



She **DIDN'T GO** to the park.



"They **had** a good teacher in primary school."

They **DIDN'T HAVE** a good teacher in primary school.

"Samy **saw** a bird singing in the window."

Samy **DIDN'T SEE** a bird singing in the window.

¿Ves cómo los verbos vuelven a escribirse "normales"?

LO MISMO pasa con las **PREGUNTAS**: vamos a usar el auxiliar **DID** delante del sujeto (personas, cosas) y el verbo de nuevo **se quedará en su estado "normal"**:

"She **went** to the park."



DID she **GO** to the park?

Yes, she **DID**. No, she **DIDN'T**.



"They **had** a good teacher in primary school."

DID they **HAVE** a good teacher in primary school?

Yes, they **DID**. No, they **DIDN'T**.

"Samy **saw** a bird singing in the window."

DID Samy **SEE** a bird singing in the window?

Yes, he **DID**. No, he **DIDN'T**.

Did they see any animals? Yes! They saw ducks, birds and a brown dog.

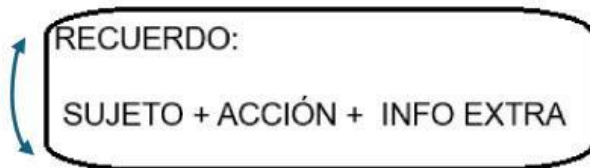
The dog didn't bark, it played with them! Leo took a photo with the dog.
