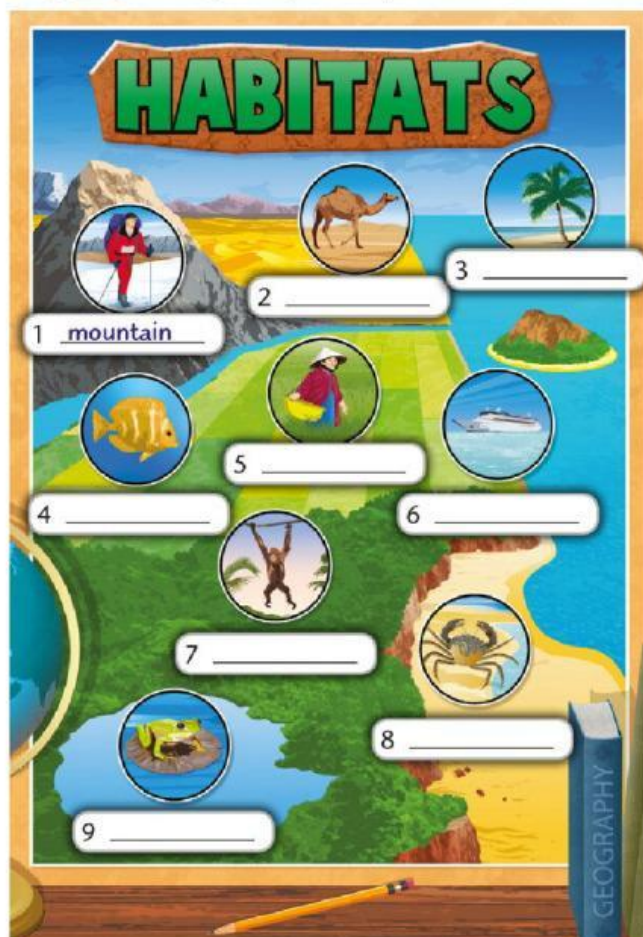

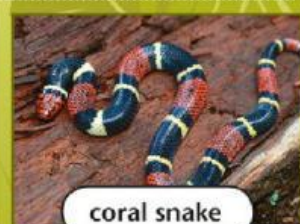
Endangered animals

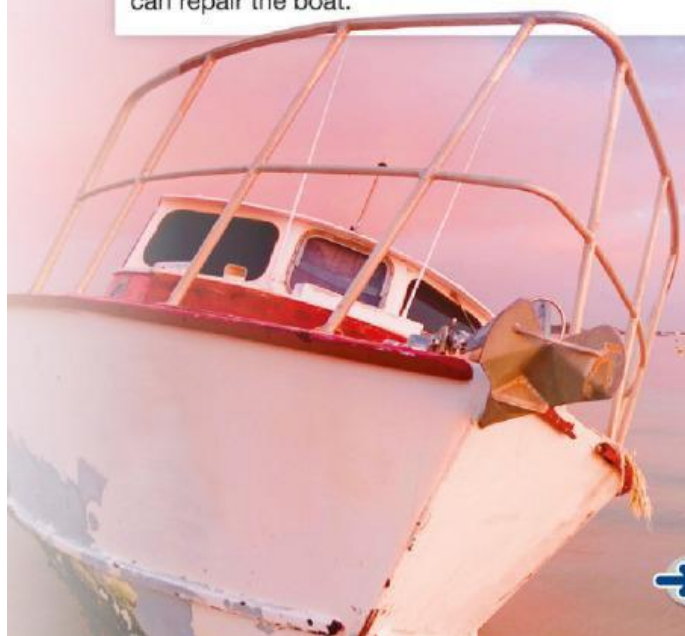
