## Celebrities

Jacques Cousteau

Jacques Cousteau (1910–1997) was a French explorer acknowledged for his several books, documentaries, and underwater expeditions. He co-invented the “aqualung,” a breathing device still used for diving, and is considered the father of modern underwater archaeology. He always had a great interest in studying inaccessible areas and, with the help of some friends, developed the technology to shoot his first underwater movie, *Eighteen Meters Deep*, in 1943. Cousteau was also an ecologist and, in 1960, managed to stop a large amount of radioactive waste from being dumped in the Mediterranean Sea by the French government. In 1973, he created The Cousteau Society, an environmental protection foundation that now has 300,000 members. He was invited to Brazil in 1992 to take part in the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development.
