Tom: By the way, did you hear about Mark? He told me, "*I'm moving to Canada next month.*" → Tom said that Mark _____ (move) to Canada the following month.

Emma: That's news to me! But yesterday John said, "*Mark left two weeks ago.*" → Emma said that John _____ (say) Mark _____ (leave) two weeks earlier.

Tom: Oh, that's confusing. And Anna said, "*Don't worry, it's old news.*" → Tom said that Anna _____ (say) it _____ (be) old news.

Emma: Speaking of news, David told me, "*The new report is hot off the press.*" → Emma said that David _____ (say) the new report _____ (be) hot off the press.

Tom: Yeah, and the newspaper said, "*It's front-page news.*" → Tom said the newspaper _____ (report) it _____ (be) front-page news.

Emma: Well, in the end, no news is good news. My mom always told me, "*If you don't hear anything, it's probably fine.*" → Emma said her mom _____ (always / tell) her that if she _____ (not hear) anything, it _____ (probably / be) fine.
