

# Crossing the Jordan - Conquering Jericho

Joshua 3:1, 14-17; 4:23-24; 6:1-23

1. How did the Israelites know where to go?  
They were to follow the Priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant  
They were to follow the trail that was left for them  
There would be a map buried under the fourth tree that they passed
2. How far were the people supposed to stay from the Ark of the Covenant?  
10 foot steps  
A half mile  
2 miles
3. Who was to guide the people to Jericho?  
Rahab  
The King  
The Levitical priests
4. What did Joshua tell the people to do before leaving?  
Eat a meal  
Purify themselves  
Confess their sins
5. What did God tell Joshua?  
God would make him a great leader and the Israelites would know that God was with him  
He would follow in the footsteps of Adam  
God would bless him with a family
6. What did God tell Joshua to tell to the priests who carried the Ark of the Covenant?  
"When you reach the banks of the Jordan River, take a few steps into the river and stop there"  
"When you reach the gate of Jericho, shout three times and the gate will be opened"  
"Set up an altar with twelve stones taken from the Jordan River"
7. What did Joshua tell the Israelites regarding the Ark of the Covenant?  
The Ark of the Covenant could not be touched by anyone but the priests  
The Ark of the Covenant would lead them across the Jordan River  
They were to follow the Ark of the Covenant all the way to Bethlehem
8. How many men were the Priests to choose?  
Twenty-four, 2 from each tribe  
Twenty-eight  
Twelve, one from each tribe
9. Who was to carry the Ark of the Covenant?  
Adam  
The Priests  
Joshua
10. What did the Ark of the Covenant represent?  
Joshua's authority  
The chosen one  
The Lord's presence
11. What happened when the feet of the priests who were carrying the Ark touched the water?  
The water turned to blood  
The River dried up and all the water disappeared  
The waters of the Jordan River stood up like a wall and allowed the Israelites to cross on dry ground.

12. Why did God allow the Israelites to cross the Jordan on dry ground?  
To show the power of God  
So they didn't get wet  
To get them where they needed to go
13. Why were the gates of Jericho tightly shut?  
To keep everyone out, except for those who lived there  
The people of Jericho were afraid of the Israelites  
To protect the families of Jericho
14. What did God instruct Joshua and the Israelites to do when they reached Jericho?  
Collect twelve stones and carry them to Jericho  
Knock the Gate down and kill everyone in the town  
March around the town once a day for 6 days and then seven times on the seventh day
15. What did God instruct the people to do when they heard the long blast of the rams' horns?  
Lay on the ground  
Make a large circle around the whole town  
Shout as loud as they could
16. What did God say would happen after the people shouted?  
The walls would collapse so that the people could go straight into the town  
The gate would swing open  
God's presence would come out of the Arc of the Covenant
17. On what day did the Lord tell the people to march around the town seven times?  
The Seventh day  
The Twelfth day  
The First day
18. What happened when the people heard the rams' horns and shouted as loud as they could?  
The Arc of the Covenant disappeared  
Rahab and her family escaped  
The walls of Jericho collapsed and the Israelites charged straight into the town and captured it
19. Why did God tell the Israelites to march around the town and shout in order for the walls of Jericho to fall?  
To weaken the gate and cause it to open  
God was testing their obedience to Him  
To let everyone in the area know that the town was safe
20. Did the 3 spies keep their promise to Rahab and her family to keep them safe?

21. What did Joshua tell the men to grab from the middle of the Jordan River?  
Flags  
Stones  
Gold
22. Where did Joshua set up the twelve stones they had taken out of the Jordan River?  
Jerusalem  
Gilgal, on the Eastern border of Jericho  
The road to Manascus
23. What did the 12 stones that were set up represent?  
God favored the Israelites  
God allowed Israel to cross the Jordan on dry ground, to show the power of God  
The Chosen people
