

PRESENT SIMPLE AFFIRMATIVE

I swim

You swim

He/She/ It swims

We/You/They swim

We add **-es**, when a verb ends in: **-o, -ch, -sh, -x, -s, -ss, -z, -zz**

I watch – He/She/It watches; I wash – He/She/It washes

and **-ies** when a verb ends in consonant + 'y' > *I try – He/She/It tries*
