

Topic 3

Summary of Procedures

Part 1

In this part of the Speaking test, each student interacts with the interlocutor, using the language normally associated with meeting people for the first time and giving personal information such as name, place of origin, grade, family, etc. Students are also expected to be able to talk about their daily lives, interests, likes, etc.

Part 2

Prompt cards are used to stimulate questions and non-personal factual answers. The interlocutor reads the instructions aloud and gives a question card to one student and an answer card to the other. After the students have asked and answered the questions, they change roles.
