	Present perfect progressive	Present perfect simple
Uses	When we focus on time (since – for)	When we focus on numbers
Forms	Has / have + been + v (ing)	Has / have + p.p
example	I have been running for one hour	I have ran three time last week
Question	How long have you been running?	How many times have you ran?
negative	I haven't been running for one hour	I haven't ran three times last week
