The fast pace of modern day family life can make it easy to forget that simply just spending time with our children is really important. Our time is one of the greatest things we can give them. There are some reasons why you should make quality time a priority:

Firstly, spending time together builds children's self-esteem. Children who spend time with their parents participating in activities together build a positive sense of self-worth. When children feel that they are **valued** by their parents, **they** feel more positive about themselves. Family activities don't have to be expensive trips out to be meaningful, the important part is just being together. You could go for a bike ride or play a game together.

Families who share everyday activities together form strong, emotional bonds. Studies have found that families who enjoy group activities together share a stronger emotional bond as well as an ability to adapt well to situations as a family. You could share your favourite hobbies, sports, books, movies or other favourite activities.

When you spend time with your children, you are developing an environment for open communication. Good communication is important for your children to feel comfortable with talking about anything. Asking how their day has gone can make a big difference.

Children learn by example. If you are setting a good example for them by spending quality time together, they are more likely to adopt those behaviours in other relationships in their lives. Simple things like playing games together will help them understand more about interacting with others as well as teach them things like sharing and kindness.

Children who help out around the house with family chores will grow as a person. Confidence can improve as your children learn and use their abilities to achieve a chore goal. Additionally, children can learn to feel proud of their work when they are reminded that their chores help everyone in the family. When children take part in the family chore load, there are benefits for everyone. power struggles with parents. Children will begin feeling more successful and confident as they master new chores, and everyone will feel proud of the work that's done.

It's important to keep a few things in mind when assigning chores to your kids. First and foremost, keep chores age and developmentally appropriate and be specific with instructions when working with younger children. Consistency and patience helps children take on new chore responsibilities, so stick with the family plan!

Chores benefit children and parents alike. They are an important way for you to help children feel like they are contributing members of the family household. This, in turn, helps **them** to learn a sense of belonging and the value of being a contributing member of a group. This value can grow as they do. So, whether through a school project, neighbourhood clean-up, showing up to soccer practice on time, or serving lunch at the local soup kitchen, all of us benefit from children taking part in chores.
