So, you want to be a writer? Well, the first step is to start writing. You don't have to write for several hours at a time, but it is important that you write every day. You could write for between 30 minutes and 1 hour to begin with. Decide on a time and place and continue with this routine no matter what happens. Try to work somewhere quiet where you can be alone and turn off the TV and your phone. Some people listen to their favourite music, but silence works better for me.

What about when you don't have any ideas? Some people worry about this and stop writing, but the best thing to do is to keep writing anyway. Eventually, the words will come. You can find ideas everywhere: in people, places and things. You should also read lots of books because you can learn a lot from the way other writers create their stories.

While I was writing my first novel, I did a writing course. I found this was a great way to get the opinion of writers. I also learned a lot about plot, setting, characters and dialogue during this course. It was a really good experience and I advise all writers to do the same.

The next step is to send your work to agents and editors. But before you do that, you must make sure your work is perfect. Read it many times yourself and then give it to a friend to check for spelling or grammar mistakes. After that, choose who you want to send it to and write a letter. I've written six novels, but sending my work to my editor is always the most terrifying part. Good luck!
