1. Key Concepts & Content

Scenario: Choosing a Color Scheme for a New Bus Fleet

You are part of a transportation company team. Your task is to choose the right **paint coating** for the new buses. You need to consider:

- **Primary, secondary, and tertiary colors**
- **Types of paint and finishes** (glossy, matte, metallic)
- **Application process** (primer, base coat, top coat)
- **Professional requirements** (visibility, durability, company standards)

Term	Spanish meaning	Definition	Example Sentence
Primary colors		Red, blue, yellow – cannot be mixed	<i>Red is a primary color.</i>
Secondary colors		Colors made by mixing two primaries	<i>Orange is made from red + yellow.</i>
Tertiary colors		Mix of a primary and secondary	<i>Blue-green is a tertiary color.</i>
Hue		Basic color family	<i>The hue of this stripe is green.</i>
Tint		A lighter version of a color (add white)	<i>We used a light tint of blue.</i>
Shade		A darker version of a color (add black)	<i>This shade is darker than the base coat.</i>
Matte		Non-shiny finish	<i>Safety vehicles often use a matte finish.</i>
Glossy		Shiny finish	<i>A glossy finish improves visibility.</i>
Metallic		Finish with reflective particles	<i>The car has a metallic silver finish.</i>
Primer		First paint layer for adhesion	<i>You must apply two coats of primer.</i>
Base coat		Main color layer	<i>The base coat is blue.</i>
Top coat		Protective final layer	<i>We applied a glossy top coat.</i>
Blend		To mix smoothly	<i>Blend the pigments carefully.</i>
Spray		Apply paint with a spray gun	<i>They are spraying the chassis now.</i>
Chassis		The frame of a vehicle	<i>The chassis is coated with anti-rust paint.</i>
Corrosion-resistant		Protects against rust	<i>This bus needs a corrosion-resistant coating.</i>
Customized finish		Special design/color	<i>The client requested a customized finish.</i>
Uniform color		Same color across vehicles	<i>The fleet has a uniform white color.</i>
Drying time		How long paint needs to dry	<i>This paint has a short drying time.</i>

4. Student Exercises

Listening (Script provided below)

⌚ **Task:** Listen to the supervisor explaining the painting process. Write down the three main steps.

Audio Script:

“First, apply a layer of primer. Then, spray the base coat in two thin layers. Finally, add the top coat for protection and shine.”

Question: What are the three steps mentioned?

Speaking (Role Play)

⌚ **Task:** In pairs, role-play a *client and technician* conversation.

- Client: asks for recommendations about colors and finishes.
- Technician: suggests options using comparatives, preferences, and modals.

3. Why did they add a glossy top coat?

Writing

 **Task:** Design a paint scheme for a new bus. Write 6–8 sentences describing:

- The **colors** (primary, secondary, tertiary)
- The **finish** (matte, glossy, metallic)
- The **application steps** (primer, base coat, top coat)
- Your **recommendation** for durability

Example starter:

“Our design uses a red-orange stripe on a white base coat. The finish is glossy to improve visibility at night...”

5. Functional Language
