B. Verb to be + verb + ing

The Present Continuous tense is formed by using the verb 'to be' in the present (am/is/are) plus the base verb with an '-ing' ending. This structure shows an action happening right now or around the current time.

2. Which of the following sentences correctly uses the Present Continuous tense to describe an action happening right now?

C. I am recording video now.

The Present Continuous tense is used to describe actions happening at the moment of speaking. The correct sentence uses 'am/is/are' + verb + ing to show the current action.

3. How can the Present Continuous tense express a future event?

A. By showing an action planned or expected in the near future.

The Present Continuous can express a planned future event, especially when it is something arranged or expected to happen soon.

4. If someone says, 'I am studying medicine these days,' what does the Present Continuous tense indicate here?

Questions in Present Continuous use the verb 'to be' before the subject, followed by the verb with -ing to ask about current actions.

6. Why is 'now' often used with the Present Continuous tense?

C. Because it highlights actions happening at the moment.

'Now' emphasizes that the action is happening at this exact moment, which is the key use of the Present Continuous tense.

7. Which of these sentences incorrectly uses the Present Continuous tense?

D. He is knowing the answer.

The Present Continuous should not be used with stative verbs or to talk about permanent facts. The incorrect sentence uses it for a permanent state.

8. Explain one common use of the Present Continuous tense to describe future events.

It is used to talk about planned or arranged events in the near future, like appointments or meetings, for example, 'I am meeting my friend tomorrow.'

9. How do you form a negative sentence in the Present Continuous tense?

Use the verb 'to be' + not + verb + ing. For example, 'I am not studying now.'
