Am, is are?

Affirmative	Negative
I am = I'm	I am not = I'm not
It is = It's She is = She's He is = He's	It is not = It isn't She is not = She isn't He is not = He isn't
They are = They're You are = You're We are = We're	They are not = They aren't You are not = You aren't We are not = We aren't


Sentence structures:

Affirmative:  + **am** / **is** / **are** + complement

I **am** a teacher = I'm a teacher

My friends **are** at the cinema

The bear **is** hungry

Negative:  + **am not** / **isn't** / **aren't** + complement

I **am** **not** in Bogotá = I'm **not** in Bogotá
She **is** **not** a student = she **isn't** a student
We **are** **not** fat = we **aren't** fat

Interrogative: Am / Is / Are +  + complement?

Am I sad? → Yes, I **am** / No, I'm **not**. I'm happy
Are you at home? → Yes, I **am** / No, I'm **not**. I'm at school
Is Carlos a doctor? → Yes, he **is** / No, he **isn't**. He **is** a pilot
