What You Need:

1. A device (computer, tablet, or smartphone) with internet access:
2. Access to ChatGPT with image generation capability,
3. Your creativity and imagination.

Steps:

1. Decide the theme or subject.
Think about what kind of image you want: a landscape, animal, character, fantasy scene, object, or other themes/subjects.
 2. Use clear and descriptive words
Mention specific details such as colors, environment, mood, lighting, and action. For example: "Generate a white-feathered swan peacefully floating on the water with a romantic blue night as the backdrop
 3. Add style or art preference (optional):
If you want a specific style, include it. For example, in anime style", "like a watercolor painting, or "realistic 3D render
 4. Mention the composition (optional)
You can add details like "low angle," "dome-up" "background mountains, etc.
 5. Avoid vague or unclear instructions
Words like "cool" or "beautiful" are too general and subjective. Be specific about what makes it cool or beautiful
 6. Review and refine your prompt.
Before submitting, read your prompt again and improve clarity if needed. Make sure your prompt clearly describes the image you want.
 7. Use as reference, not as a final product
The best practice of using AI-generated images is to use it as reference for your own, personally made creative project.
