

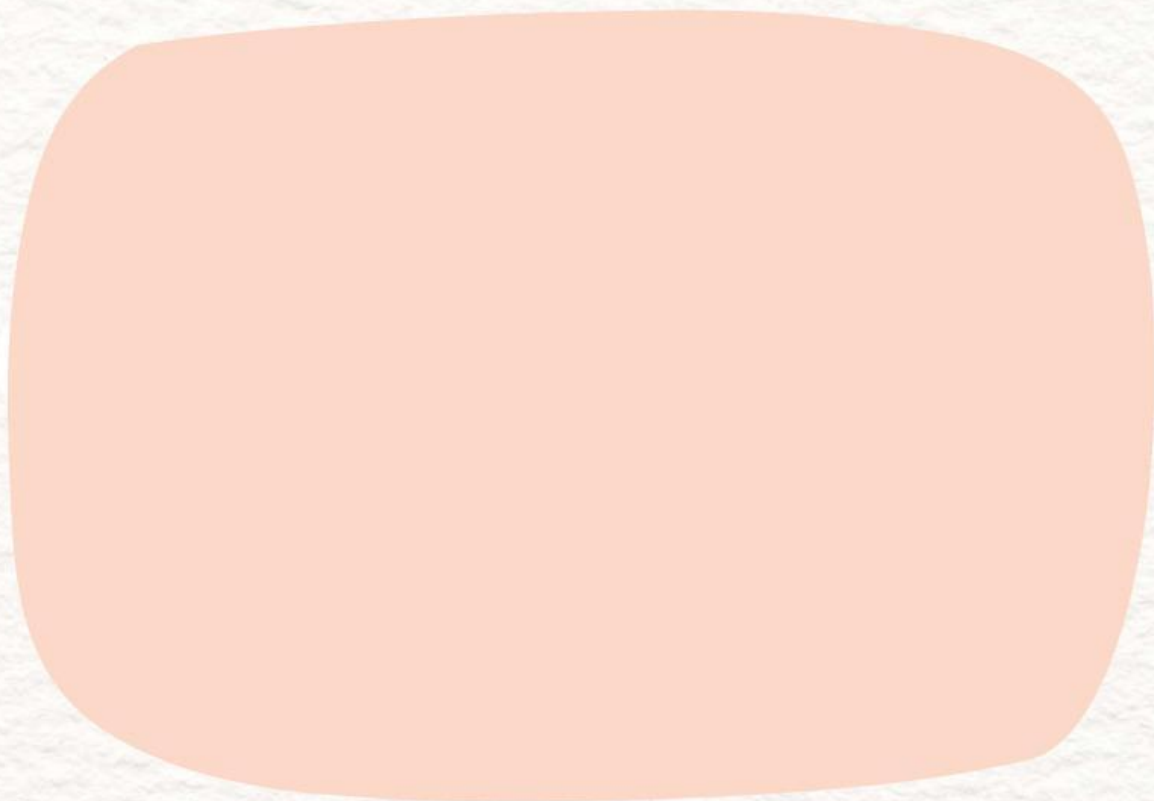

Borobudur Temple

Borobudur Temple is an ancient and majestic Buddhist monument located in Magelang, Central Java, Indonesia. Built in the 9th century, it remains one of the largest Buddhist temples in the world.
