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WILL VS. GOING TO



We use "will" to talk about spontaneous plans decided at the moment of speaking.

We use "going to" to talk about plans decided before the moment of speaking.

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Aspect	Will	Going to
Affirmative	I will go to the store later.	I am going to visit my friend tomorrow.
Negative	I will not go to the store later.	They are not going to buy a new car next month.
Yes/No Questions	Will you go to the store later?	Are they going to buy a new car next month?
Wh Questions	When will she study for the exam?	Where are you going to visit tomorrow?

	Example	Explanation
Scheduled Events	I am meeting my friend tomorrow.	When talking about events that are already planned or scheduled to happen in the future.
Future Plans	They are not traveling next month.	Discussing arrangements or intentions for the future, especially when there's a specific time frame involved.
Arrangements	Are we leaving for the airport at 5?	Referring to future arrangements, such as appointments or meetings.
Personal Arrangements	What time are you taking the bus tomorrow?	Describing personal plans or actions that will take place in the future.
