1. WINDSOR CASTLE (Berkshire)

Windsor Castle is the largest and oldest _____ castle in the world. It serves as one of the **official residences** of the British royal family. The castle contains grand halls, formal gardens, and a beautiful chapel. Visitors often watch the Changing of the Guard and explore the **magnificent buildings**.

2. THE COTSWOLDS (South-Central England)
