What to Wear

The wedding day is one of the most exciting days in a couple's life, but it can also be stressful. The bride and groom have to decide what to wear.

Queen Victoria of England started the tradition of wearing a white dress more than 170 years ago. She wasn't the first to wear a white wedding dress, but she made it more popular than the typical red dress of that time.

While wearing white is traditional in most English-speaking countries, in Ireland the bride should wear blue because it is considered good luck. In Scotland it's often the men who wear more colorful clothes called kilts, which are worn to represent their family. Some of the most common colors are red, blue, and green.

Across the world, weddings are a rainbow of color. Chinese couples often choose red because it represents joy and luck. In India red and white are worn because it's believed that these colors bring wealth and a large family. Weddings in Africa are colorful celebrations. Nigerian men and women wear bright clothes called aso-ebi, meaning "family cloth." In Morocco the tradition is to wear yellow and green. There, yellow warns away evil spirits, and green brings good luck.

From white to red and all the colors of the rainbow in between, couples all over the world choose different but colorful clothes for their wedding day.
