 **According to the composition of the load**

1. means a shipping term for when a single shipper books and pays for the exclusive use of an entire shipping container, regardless of whether it is completely filled
2. a shipping method where multiple shippers share space in a single shipping container for their smaller cargo. Shippers pay only for the portion of the container their goods occupy, which is more economical than paying for an entire container when their shipment is too small to fill one

 **According to the shape**

3. → a standard closed container;
4. → a container with one or more side open doors;
5. → a container with a removable roof for tall cargo
6. → a type of open shipping container without a roof or side walls, designed for loads that due to their size or shape do not fit in standard containers, such as heavy machinery,
7. → a large, intermodal container for transporting and storing bulk liquids, gases, or powders
8. → a container designed to maintain a constant internal temperature, protecting contents from external heat and cold
9. → a specialized shipping container with a built-in refrigeration unit to transport temperature-sensitive goods like food, pharmaceuticals, and flowers over long distances
10. → a specialized storage or transport container that can be heated to a desired temperature.
11. → a unit designed to maintain a specific temperature for goods during transport or storage, protecting them from fluctuations that could affect their quality or safety
12. → a modular, space-saving unit that can be collapsed into a smaller, flatter shape for easier transportation and storage when not in use.

13. → is a specialized container or pallet designed for use in air cargo transport, typically shaped to fit the curved interior of an aircraft. They are essential in air freight logistics, allowing goods to be safely loaded, secured, and transported inside aircraft cargo holds.
