The Michelin Guide

What is a Michelin star? A Michelin star is the highest award a restaurant can get. The history of this star is connected to a famous guide to restaurants, called *The Michelin Guide*. It is the oldest and most famous European restaurant guide. In 1936, the writers of *The Michelin Guide* began to give stars to the food at restaurants. They called them "Michelin stars". According to the guide, one star means "a very good restaurant" and two stars is "excellent cooking". If a restaurant receives three stars, the most it can get, it means that "the food will amaze you". People all over the world follow this guide when they visit Europe.
