Example: We walked along the river after dinner.

already /ə'lədɪ/ (adv)

Example: I have already finished my homework.

alright /ə'ləʊt/ (adj, adv & exclam)

Example: Alright, let's start the meeting!

Your sentence:

also /'əlsəʊ/ (adv)

Example: She is smart and also very kind.

always /'ə:lweɪz/ (adv)

Example: He always gets up early.

a.m. /'eɪ'əm/

Example: The class starts at 8 a.m.

Example: I was amazed by the beautiful view.
