Example: Are you all right? You look tired.

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**all sorts of** /ɔ:l sɔ:ts əv/ (det & pron)

Example: There are all sorts of cakes at the party, moose, tiramisu, croissant.

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**all the time** /ɔ:l ðə taɪm/ (det)

Example: She is on her phone all the time.

Example: I almost missed the bus this morning.

Example: Alright, let's start the meeting!

Example: She is smart and also very kind.

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**always** /'ɔ:lweɪz/ (adv)

Example: He always gets up early.

Example: The class starts at 8 a.m.

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**amazed** /ə'meɪzd/ (adj)

Example: I was amazed by the beautiful view.

Example: It's raining, but I'll go out anyway.

Example: They live in a small apartment near the city center.
