

GRAMMAR POINT:

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

(AFFIRMATIVE AND NEGATIVE)

FORM

(+) : S + am/is/are + Ving + O.

Ex His friends are listening to music on his phone.

(-) : S + am/is/are + NOT + Ving + O.

Ex My dad is not working now.

Finding spelling rules

Sometimes the final letter of a verb can show you how to spell the continuous form.

- Look at verbs that end in -e. Do you keep or delete the -e before you add -ing?
- Look at verbs that end in a short vowel and then a consonant. What letter is added before -ing?



GRAMMAR POINT:

PRESENT CONTINUOUS (QUESTIONS)

FORM

Yes / No questions

Am/ Is / Are + S + Ving + O?

Yes, S + am / is / are.

No, S + am / is / are not.

Ex

A: Is your mom cooking?

B: Yes, she is. & No, she isn't.



GRAMMAR POINT:

PRESENT CONTINUOUS (QUESTIONS)

FORM

Information questions

Question word (What, where, when,...)

+ Am/ Is / Are + S + Ving + O?

Ex

A: What are you doing?

B: I'm reading a book.
