

PRESENT PERFECT WITH **EVER** AND **NEVER**

EVER → to ask questions about experiences. It means “at any time up to now”.

*Have you **ever** ridden a camel?*

*Have you **ever** been to China?*

We can also use ever in affirmative sentences. We often use it after a **superlative** in order to emphasize.

*This is **the best** concert I've **ever** been to.*

*This is **the worst** breakfast I've **ever** eaten.*

NEVER → to talk about experiences which we haven't had, we use *never* and an **affirmative** present perfect form.

*I've **never** seen a giraffe.*

*Sarah has **never** written a postcard.*
