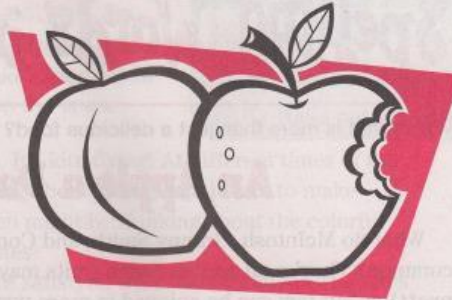

happy + **er** = happier
happy + **est** = happiest
