When a vowel is sounded alone in a word, it usually forms a syllable by itself, as in an • i • mal. When a word ends in a consonant + le, divide the word before that consonant, as in ve • hi • cle. These syllabication rules, and those you have already learned, will help you to spell and pronounce the **list words**.

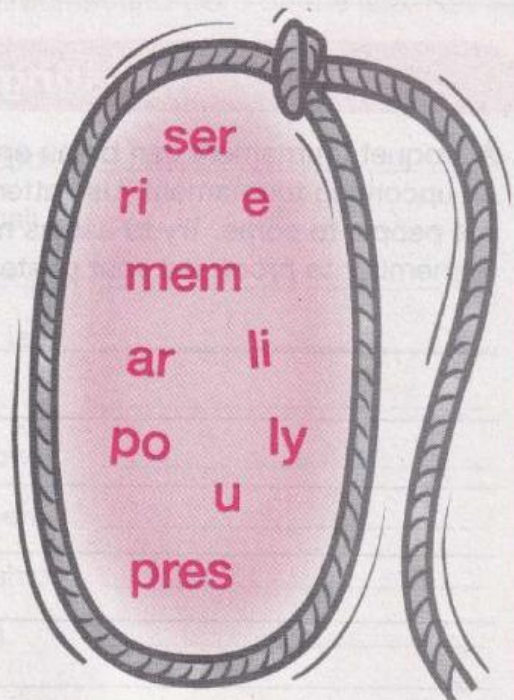

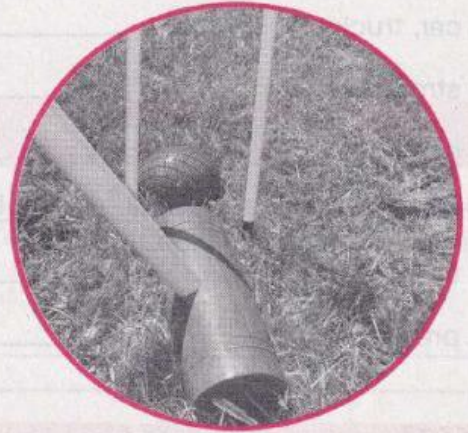
