### **Would you really be happy?**

Many people think, "If I had more money, I'd be happy!" But is this true? Daniel Gilbert, a professor from Harvard University, researched this issue, and his conclusions are fascinating. Gilbert found that if our basic needs are met, the happiness we get from having more money is really very small.

This is because we all have the ability to change in different environments. For example, if a person moved to a hot country, he or she would feel very hot at first, but eventually the heat would feel normal. In the same way, when a person has more money, he or she can buy exciting new things and feel happy. Over time, these things become normal, not exciting. So the person tries to buy more new things to feel happy again.

The person also discovers that having more money causes more stress. If the person buys an expensive car or a big house, he or she has to look after it. There are always more things to worry about. For most people who didn't use to have a lot of money, there is a fear of losing everything. These people aren't able to enjoy the things they have if they are focused on losing them. Many people also feel that other people want what they have, and this causes more stress.
