Also, make sure you take a map of the area, your mobile phone and some food with you in a waterproof container.

Whatever you do, always wear a life jacket, and don't paddle farther away from the shore (or river bank) than you're able to swim. If you follow the safety instructions for your canoe, you'll be all right. If, however, your canoe happens to overturn, stay with it and attract help. Also, carry a whistle to use in emergencies.

Finally, remember to respect other people in or near the water. Don't paddle close to swimmers, people fishing or wildlife. Of course, you shouldn't pollute the water, either. So keep your rubbish with you!
