

FUTURE TENSES

The main future tenses we have studied are:

PRESENT SIMPLE- used for timetabled or scheduled events (school, planes etc)

PRESENT CONTINUOUS – used for future arrangements (meetings, doctors appointments etc)

WILL + INFINITIVE – future predictions, promises and offers

(MIGHT and COULD can be used in place of WILL if you are uncertain)

BE + GOING TO + INFINITIVE – used for future intentions and plans
