

Mixed Conditional

Mixed Conditional Third/ Second Conditionals

Structure	IF + Past Perfect, Present Conditional (would/wouldn't + Verb (bare form))
Usage	Present result of a past condition
Examples	• If I <u>had listened</u> to your advice, I <u>wouldn't be</u> in the mess. • If he <u>had checked</u> the map, he <u>wouldn't be</u> lost. • If I <u>had gone</u> to university, I <u>would be</u> a doctor now.

Structure	IF + Past Simple, Perfect Conditional (would/wouldn't + have + Past Participle)
Usage	Past result of a present or continuing condition
Examples	• If I <u>were</u> a good cook, I <u>would have invited</u> them to dinner. • If you <u>weren't</u> such a poor dancer, you <u>would have got</u> a job in the chorus line in that musical.
