Lesson Objectives

- Learn vocabulary related to ship crew roles (English-Spanish)
- Understand and use the Present Simple for routines and duties
- Practice all four skills (listening, speaking, reading, writing)
- Build confidence in real-life onboard communication situations

Grammar Focus: Present Simple for Routines

We use the Present Simple to talk about daily routines and regular duties.

Structure:

Subject	Verb	Example
I/You/We/They	base verb	I work on the deck.
He/She/It	base verb + s	He starts at 6:00 a.m.

Spelling Rules for 3rd person singular

- Add **-s**: work → works, clean → cleans
 - Verbs ending in **-ch, -sh, -x, -ss**: add **-es**: watch → watches
 - Verbs ending in consonant + **y**: change **y** → **ies**: study → studies
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Key Vocabulary (with Spanish Translation)

English Term	Spanish	Definition	Example Sentence
Master (Captain)	Capitán	Highest-ranking officer	The Master is responsible for the whole ship.
Chief Officer	Primer Oficial	Supervises deck crew and cargo	The Chief Officer checks the deck every morning.
2nd Officer	Segundo Oficial	Assists with navigation	The 2nd Officer updates charts.
3rd Officer	Tercer Oficial	Assists with safety and navigation	The 3rd Officer checks the lifeboats.
Chief Engineer	Jefe de Máquinas	Head of engine department	The Chief Engineer inspects the engine room.
2nd/3rd/4th Engineer	Segundo/Tercer/Cuarto Ingeniero	Assist in engine maintenance	The 2nd Engineer monitors the fuel.
Electrical Engineer	Ingeniero Eléctrico	Handles electrical systems	The Electrical Engineer fixes the lights.
Bosun	Contraestre	Leads deck crew	The Bosun gives tasks to the ABs.
AB (Able Seaman)	Marinero Calificado	Experienced deck crew	The AB paints and handles ropes.
OS (Ordinary Seaman)	Marinero Ordinario	Junior deck crew	The OS helps clean the deck.
Motorman	Engrasador	Works in engine room	The Motorman checks the oil levels.
Wiper	Limpiador	Cleans engine parts	The Wiper cleans and assists engineers.
Fitter	Ajustador	Handles equipment fitting	The Fitter installs metal parts.
Pumpman	Bompista	Manages pump systems	The Pumpman monitors tank levels.
Welder	Soldador	Repairs metal structures	The Welder fixes damaged pipes.
Carpenter	Carpintero	Repairs wooden parts	The Carpenter fixes doors and panels.

Cook	Cocinero	Prepares meals	The Cook starts breakfast at 5:30 a.m.
Steward (Messman)	Camarero	Assists in the kitchen and mess	The Steward cleans the tables.

Key Concepts & Content

Dialogue: Onboard Conversation

Characters: Luis (a new O S) and Peter (an Able Seaman)

Luis: Good morning! I'm Luis, the new Ordinary Seaman. Nice to meet you!

Peter: Hi Luis, welcome aboard! I'm Peter, an Able Seaman. Do you know your duties already?

Luis: A little. I know I help with **cleaning** the deck and **assisting** the officers. What time do you start work?

Peter: I usually start at 8:00 a.m. I **paint** the deck, **handle ropes**, and help during docking operations. It's busy!

Luis: That sounds interesting. What about the Chief Officer?

Peter: He begins early, around 6:00 a.m. He **checks cargo** and **supervises** us. He also attends safety meetings.

Luis: And the Cook?

Peter: Oh, the Cook starts even earlier—at 5:30! Meals need to be ready on time.

Luis: I see. Everyone has their routine.

Peter: Yes, life on board is very organized. You'll learn quickly!
