3. It was an amphitheatre capable of seating around 50,000 spectators. People came here to watch gory games involving gladiators, wild animals and prisoners.

5. It is an ancient city famous for its stone structures such as a 138-foot tall temple carved into rose colour rock.

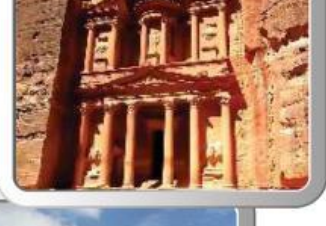
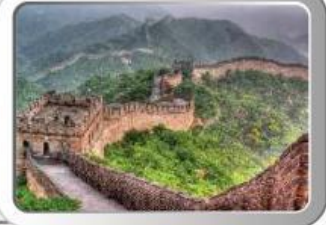
The _____, Jordan
