Christian the Lion

Today we don't usually keep wild animals as pets, but in 1969 a famous London shop, *Harrods*, sold lions, tigers and camels. John Randall and Anthony Bourke bought a baby lion *cub* there and named him Christian.

Christian lived with John and Anthony in their flat, where they looked after him. They fed him steak and sausages that they bought from the supermarket, instead of small animals that lions eat in the wild. Every morning for exercise, they took him to a quiet park to play, and occasionally they took him to the beach.

A female lion, or lioness, grows up to 2.7 metres long but a male lion like Christian can be three metres long and 1.2 metres tall. After a year, Christian was too big to live in the flat and it was risky to take him outside. John and Anthony had to make a big decision. In 1970, they took him to Kenya, where he could run free in the wild. They worked with animal experts and helped Christian join a *pride*, or group, of lions. They returned in 1971 and 1973 and hoped to see Christian. They were surprised when he recognised them, putting his front *paws*, or feet, on the men's shoulders. Christian spent his later years free, and in the 1980s he was leading his pride and having *cubs* of his own.
