

PRESENT SIMPLE

We use the Simple Present to talk about:

- Routines or habits → things we do every day.
- General facts or truths.
- Permanent situations.



Sentence type	Formula	Example
Affirmative	Subject + base verb	She <i>plays</i> soccer. / I <i>work</i> at a school.
Negative	Subject + don't / doesn't	I <i>don't like</i> coffee. / He <i>doesn't watch</i> TV.
Question	Do / Does + subject +	<i>Do</i> you study English? / <i>Does</i> she read books?

Important notes:

Add **-s** or **-es** to the verb when the subject is **he, she, or it**.

👉 **He works, She goes, It rains.**

Don't add "s" when the subject is **I, you, we, or they**.

👉 **I work, They play.**

Examples:

- I **get up** at 7:00 **every day**.
- She **likes** pizza.
- They **study English** on Mondays.
- We **don't watch** TV in the morning.
- Does he **play soccer**? — Yes, he **does**.
