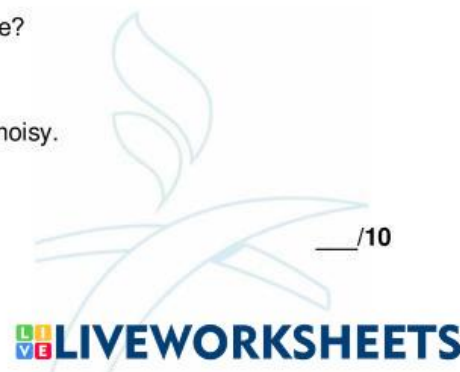

What else does Ivan find difficult in Dublin? He says that Irish people he has met have been very welcoming, but he doesn't have many close friends here yet. 'I play football after school so I know a few people. They're very nice but they've been friends with each other for years and they always have plans with their families at the weekends. I miss my best friends from home.'

Karolina agrees with Ivan about missing her friends, but right now she's enjoying her new life in Ireland. 'I'm from Kaunas in Lithuania, where it is cold, so I don't mind the weather here! There are many Lithuanian people in Dublin, but I prefer to spend time with my new Irish friends. My English is improving every day and it's a lot of fun getting to know the city with them.'

Karolina says there are some negative stereotypes about Lithuanian migrants, but she doesn't listen to them. 'In general, I really like it here, although finding things I like to eat is a challenge. I definitely prefer Lithuanian food!' Ivan thinks the same. 'I miss my grandma's cooking! It's difficult to get Ecuadorian food in Dublin. But I'm trying hard to enjoy Irish meals – it's important to stay positive!
