Quantifiers are words or phrases we use before a noun to show the number or amount of something. We use them instead of exact numbers to describe **how much** or **how many**.

Key Rules Refresher:

- **Much** is used for a large number or amount with **uncountable nouns**.
- **Many** is used for a large number or amount with **countable nouns**.
- **A little** means **some** and is used with **uncountable nouns**.
- **Few** means **more than two** (a small number) and is used with **countable nouns**.
- **Any** is often used in **negative forms**.
- **No** means **none, nothing**.
