3a. When writing a recount text, it is important to use **chronological connectives** to show the order of events clearly. Time sequence helps readers understand when each event happened, making the story easier to follow. Use time words like "**first**," "**then**," "**after that**," and "**finally**" to link the events in the order they occurred. This way, your recount will be organized and the flow of events will be logical and clear.
