Recount Text



Definition

Recount text is a type of text that retells past events or experiences in the order they happened. It focuses on informing or sharing what occurred in the past.

Purpose

- Retell past events or personal experiences
- Inform or entertain the reader with a sequence of events
- Provide a clear chronology of what happened

Types of Recount

- Personal recount
- Factual recount
- Imaginative recount

Generic Structure

1. Orientation

Introduces the background information: who, where, when, what happened and sets the scene.

2. Events


Describes the events in chronological order (first, then, after that, finally) usually written in several paragraphs.

3. Re-orientation

A concluding sentence or comment about the whole story (can express personal feelings or summary of the experience).



