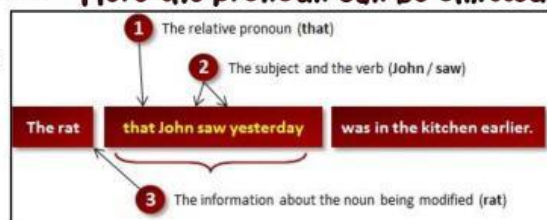

## Non-Defining Relative Clauses (between commas)

My brother,

who claimed to have a limp,

sprinted after the bus.

This is just additional information. It is not required to identify the noun being modified (brother)

The relative pronoun cannot be omitted or changed by "that".
