The Komodo dragon, the largest living lizard on Earth, is a majestic yet fearsome creature native to the rugged landscapes of Indonesia's Lesser Sunda Islands. With its massive, muscular body covered in rough, scaly skin ranging from gray to brick red, it exudes an ancient and primeval aura. Its long, powerful tail and sturdy limbs complement its stocky build, allowing it to move with surprising agility. The sharp claws and serrated teeth of the Komodo dragon are key tools in its predatory arsenal, making it a formidable hunter in its environment.

This apex predator can grow up to 10 feet in length and weigh over 150 pounds. Its forked, snake-like tongue flicks in and out of its wide mouth, aiding its keen sense of smell. A Komodo dragon can detect the scent of carrion from several miles away, a skill that supports its scavenging habits. Despite its size, it can move swiftly when necessary, especially during a hunt. Its hunting style is a combination of stealth, patience, and a lightning-quick strike that often incapacitates prey with a powerful bite. Komodo dragons possess venom glands that deliver toxins, causing blood loss, lowering blood pressure, and inducing shock in their victims. Their habitats range from dry savannahs to tropical forests, where they roam freely in search of food. They are solitary creatures, often seen basking in the sun or stalking deer, pigs, and other animals. The Komodo dragon's resilience and adaptability make it a true marvel of evolution, but it remains vulnerable due to habitat loss and human activities. These prehistoric reptiles are a symbol of Indonesia's natural heritage, drawing visitors from across the globe to witness their raw, untamed power.

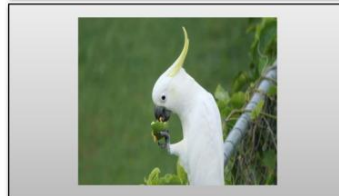

The Anoa

Have you ever heard to word "Anoa? Anoa is a type of four-legged animal which is also a typical animal of Sulawesi, which means this type of animal is very rare and is only found in Sulawesi. Anoa is considered similar to buffalo but anoa has a smaller size than buffalo. Therefore, the anoa is often referred to as the dwarf buffalo. There are two types of anoa; the mountain anoa (*Bubalus quarlesi*) and the lowland anoa (*Bubalus depressicornis*)

Anoa have a strong and round body with a straight back. They also have long, woolly hair, showing, faint spots on the head, neck, and limbs. Anoa are dark brown or black in colour and males usually have darker colour then fameles. Males and females anoas have horns that are short, flat, and become triangular towards the end.

The habitat of this anoa is nomadic, sometimes living in tropical forests, savannas and even swamp areas. In their wanderings, anoa tend to live alone, but sometimes there are some that live in groups consisting of 2-3 individuals.

Anoa are classified as herbivorous animals, animals that only eat plants as their main food, such as wild grass, sweet potato stem, fresh leaves, or swamp forest plants. They will start looking for food at night until dawn. Meanwhile, anoa often spends the day resting.

Since 1960, the anoa was declared an endangered animal and must be protected. The IUCN Red List noted that the total population size of anoa is fewer than 2,500 mature individuals. It is such as housing, fields, rice fields or plantations. Apart from that, irresponsible humans hunt anoa for their skin, meat and horns.
