


Comparatives and Superlatives

Use the comparative or the superlative.




James Tom Robert

3) Robert is the (fat)




Oliver David John

3) John is the (young)




Leopard Turtle Rabbit

3) The leopard is the (fast)




Bicycle Car Plane

3) The plane is the (comfortable)




Sam Tom Max

3) Sam is the (angry)




Football Tennis Basketball

2) Football is than Basketball. (popular)


3) Football is the (popular)




David's family Ann's family George's family
