#### Body Language.

Jessie Gallway communication specialist talks about her new book about gestures

English is the most worldwide used language. But what about body language? Body language is an aspect of nonverbal communication where physical behavior is used to convey information. In her book "Hands down!", Jessie Gallway explains how body language differs from one culture to the other. "It is important to learn body gestures and their meanings", says Jessie "Something that you think is friendly and polite may absolutely mean the opposite in a different culture. This may cause you to start on the wrong foot with people you meet for the first time and who belong to a different culture"

Even a gesture as simple as greeting people could be confused with a mistake. A firm handshake, for example, is a hearty greeting unless you are in North America. A most famous misunderstanding of body language is counting numbers. Generally all people count from one to ten on their fingers alike. Surprisingly, it is not the same around the world. Chinese account for weirdest since they indicate the numbers one to ten all on one hand. For example, an extended thumb and pinkie means "six," and a fist means "ten." Imagine how confusing this can be when you're trying to communicate quantities and prices with your hands!

In her book, Jessie leaves the reader with a few tips to avoid any unintentional insults using their body language. "There is no one golden rule", exclaims Jessie, "but the best practice is how important it is to practice awareness of how your local culture interprets nonverbal cues so that you can prevent miscommunications from occurring. You should extend that awareness to other cultures if you are visiting their country. "You do not want to lose a business deal only because you thought you only waved hi !" , adds Jessie laughing.
