Reading Is Fun!

Book club members know that sharing and talking about books with others can be very rewarding. For people who feel that they are too busy to read, a book club helps them to keep up with a reading schedule. Others have gained self-confidence by participating in or leading a discussion. And most people enjoy the chance to make new friends.

A successful book club should be small enough so quiet people can be heard, but also big enough for many different opinions. The best arrangement is a mixture of ages and backgrounds. Some book clubs meet in bookstores, public libraries, or cafés, or even

online, but most have their meetings in members' homes. This setting offers a quiet spaces and time for longer discussions.
