### How to make a career in acting

A lot of people dream of becoming a famous actor who gets to walk down the red carpet at the Oscars' ceremony. Maybe you think you haven't got what it takes, but don't let that put you off. In this article, we're going to give you some tips on how to make a career in acting.

Firstly, you need to know what's happening in the acting world. You can practise as much as you like, but if you don't get out and meet people, you won't know what's going on. If you're living in one of the big cities like London or Paris, there are usually plenty of theatrical productions, as well as TV and film opportunities. However, if you live in a smaller town, don't panic! There might not be so much happening, but it might be easier to get a part in a local production. Subscribe to local arts journals and websites so you don't miss out on opportunities where you live.

Related to the previous point, we'd recommend creating a strong social media presence for yourself. We all know that social media can be a bit annoying, but it's probably the most effective way to get yourself known in the acting world. Have you ever noticed how even A-list celebrities are never off social media? It might take time to build up followers, but try to stay positive. Upload video clips of yourself acting out your favourites scenes to give your followers a taste of your skills. Just make sure you come across well because you never know who might be watching!

Nobody ever said acting was easy and even the greatest actors put in a lot of work to stay at the top. Therefore, you need to carry on developing your skills if you want to have an advantage over the competition. One way is to enrol on an acting course at a local college, but you can also pick things up in more informal situations. Workshops are a great way to find out about different acting techniques and, if there aren't any workshops in your area, you can look out for online ones. You'll feel like you're progressing in your career even if you haven't managed to get an acting role yet.

You should also reflect on whether you've got any other talents that might help you get on in your acting career. Sometimes, we're so focused on improving our acting that we forget about the other things we're good at. However, the most successful actors are often the ones who can sing and dance as well – just think about Ryan Gosling in *La La Land*. So, if you know how to dance a tango or juggle five balls, make sure you keep practising because it might help get you a role one day.
