**Alex:** I'll take those tomatoes and these carrots. That should be all for today.

**Taylor:** Perfect! Let me pack these up for you. That will be \$12 in total.

## Singular (one item)

**THIS = near** me

Example: This apple is fresh.



**THAT = far** from me

Example: That orange is on the shelf.



## Plural (more than one item)

**THESE = near** me

Example: These bananas are cheap.



**THOSE = far** from me

Example: Those grapes look good.



<b>This</b>	1 (singular)	Near	<i>This tomato is red.</i>
<b>That</b>	1 (singular)	Far	<i>That apple is green.</i>
<b>These</b>	Many (plural)	Near	<i>These carrots are fresh.</i>
<b>Those</b>	Many (plural)	Far	<i>Those potatoes are big.</i>
